EMS Coordinator	Steve Cobb – read and submitted his report. STEMS is going to offer an EMS Officer Training Course. The course will
	be created to teach them what they need to do. CC's & Paramedics are the only ones that will handle drugs on an
	ambulance. The Sheriff is still working on getting the Deputies to be EMT's. Cattaraugus County will be putting
	together a transition course as EMT-B is changing in two years. Steve will let everyone know exactly what has to be
	done. Need to be credentialed once a year in the departments with WREMAC. The State came up with a policy for
	Nasal Narcan in mid-December. Norma is working on getting that information out. Will wait till medical Directors are
	in place. More and more departments are changing to E-PCRs. It is not mandated yet but they will put out a 12-page
	written PCR for those that don't go to E-PCR.
Dive Team	Dennis Barmore – The team assisted Kiantone & Frewsburg on a water emergency. Denny reported that the team went
	out between 40-50 times last year.

	Ashville starts February 2 <sup>nd</sup> . Murphy will have a Scene Support mid-February. Working on Survival, FAST, Rescue
