**Courses & descriptions:**

**Logger Rescue:**

Logger Rescue was designed and developed in 1996 to meet the needs of the logging work force who was lacking formal training to deal with an emergency occurring in the logging woods. It was quickly realized that the program was missing a vital component of the rescue - Fire and Emergency Medical services. Using my experience and training in the logging sector along with that of being a full time firefighter and medic, I developed the foundation of the class that is being currently offered. The program has been enhanced over the years to include the use of more scenarios and techniques that concentrate on the difficulties and problematic situations that occur in the logging sector. The course includes lecture topics consisting of training, safety, resources, planning, and communications (or lack thereof) to educate Fire and EMS in the problems faced during a logging accident. The outdoor hands on portion will involve activities in the woods using logging equipment and scenarios including the following situations: locating the victim, evaluation of the patient, type of rescue technique needed, how to extricate, (lots of chainsaw use), EMS intervention to the highest level available, carry out of the patient to an awaiting EMS unit or to a landing zone and concluding with an accident training debriefing and assisting with protocols for various departments. As time permits we will practice different scenarios throughout the class.

**Hazardous Materials Incident Command:** Must also register on LMS when class is posted. Provides the hazardous materials incident commander with the skills necessary to successfully and safely manage the incident. Includes the need for an organized approach to managing hazardous materials incidents, the required elements for an employer's emergency response plan, site-specific pre-incident emergency planning, incident analysis and the development of site safety plans, strategic goals for hazardous materials incidents, and developing a plan of action and its application and tactical objective to accomplish the strategic goals.

**FF1 Refresher Training:** Must also register on LMS when class is posted.

The Refresher Training course is a unique approach to fire training in New York State. It is designed to address the needs of veteran firefighters who have been trained for some time and are in need of skill refresher opportunities. This year's refresher course will consist of review & hands on practice of various Truck Company Operation skills utilizing Erie County's vent and survival trailers. Skills covered will include: VES – Ventilation, Forcible Entry, & Search; Ladder Ops; Power Saws; and Survival skills.

### **EMS Track: Provided by UPMC**

**Stroke Class** - In conjunction with one of our Medical Directors- Recognizing small vessel occlusion vs large vessel occlusion; Discussing treatment & appropriate transport destinations.

**Pediatrics Class** - How to treat & manage pediatrics. Airway skills, how to assess vital signs, where to transport and how to transport.

**MCI** - Hands on skills with triage/treatment/transport with a mock MCI. (We will need patient "actors" for this-if you know of someone that would like to participate, please let Jen know)

**Ambulance Simulations** - There will be a "live" manikin for this class. There will be scenarios on treating the patient on scene, loading, & transporting the patient. The team will treat the patient in the back of the ambulance while "en route to the hospital".

**Patient Packaging** - Learn how to extricate & "package" a patient in unique situations.

**Crush Injury** - Learn how to treat someone with a crush injury. Getting timeline of the incident, how long an extremity has been "crushed" & what to do....does the object get removed right away?? Or do you wait until medications have been administered?

**Highway Safety for Emergency Responders:** Must also register on LMS when class is posted.

Students completing this course will have an awareness of the serious nature of highway crash scenes and the hazards associated with them. Students will have an understanding of the four phases of traffic control that take place in the first hour. They will also possess the ability to select & place the appropriate traffic control devices for various crash sites. Other topics covered are: stopping sight distance requirements for vehicles across a broad range of speeds, how to establish various traffic control zones, where to stand and how to direct traffic.

PPE: Reflective vest & comfortable footwear and clothing appropriate for weather

**Search & Rescue:** This class will be held with members from the Chautauqua County Technical Rescue Team & STAT Medevac. Find an injured patient in the woods & learn how to care for them during the extrication process. There will be advanced rope techniques that you can learn from the Tech Team.

PPE: Appropriate clothing/jackets/shoes/work gloves for being in the woods/weather

**Traffic Incident Management System (TIMS):** The Strategic Highway Research Program developed a program, by responders-for responders, with the objective that nationally, responders acquire a common set of core competencies for traffic incident management. The process of coordinating resources of several different partner agencies and private sector companies to detect, respond to, and clear traffic incidents as quickly as possible to reduce the impacts of incidents on safety & congestion, while protecting the safety of on-scene responders and the traveling public. The safety of responders & motorists, quick response, and effective communications at traffic incident scenes are highlighted.
